TRAFFIC CONTROL PAINTER

Minimum Qualifications:

1. Must be at least 18 years of age.
2. Must be a high school graduate or have a GED equivalent and submit copy of a high school diploma or GED certificate at the time of application. (College diploma cannot be accepted as a substitute.) Documents in other languages must be translated into English.

Note: All minimum qualification documents must be submitted at the time of application.

Note: Application must be made in person and completed on site.

Selection Process:

Ranked list determined by points (see page 3). To earn points, applicants must submit written documentation of education and work or military experience at the time of application. Points scored will determine placement on the pool of eligibles. Complete selection process is available on request. Applicants will be notified and must attend an Orientation class before they can be added to the waiting list for work. Ranked lists will be created by the end of the third week of each month.

Note: Most employers will require an apprentice to:

- have a driver's license
- take a substance abuse test
- acquire a commercial driver's license

Availability of Jobs:

This notice does not mean that we have job openings at this time, but is to establish a waiting list for use when jobs become available. Most work opportunities are in the summer months.

Geographical Area: **Oregon:** Multnomah, Washington, Clackamas, Columbia, Marion, Polk, Linn, Benton, Lincoln, Douglas, Lane, Jackson, Josephine, Coos, Curry, and Yamhill Counties. **Washington:** Clark, Klickitat, Morrow, Skamania, Cowlitz, Wahkiakum Counties and that portion of Pacific County south of a straight line made by extending the north boundary line of Wahkiakum County west to the Pacific Ocean.

The Work:

Traffic Control Painters (Road and Parking Lot) apply and remove pavement signage and striping. Work involves operation of equipment and repeated lifting of tools and supplies.

Working Conditions:

The work is outside and seasonal, and requires extensive travel throughout Oregon. Jobs may require working at night. Most work is during the summer, with long work days.

Wages and Benefits:

Registered Traffic Control Painter Apprentices start at 60% of Journeyman wage and are re-evaluated every six months for advancement.

1 st	2,333 hour period	60% of average wage
2 nd	2,333 hour period	73% of average wage
3 rd	2,334 hour period	88% of average wage

As of July 1, 2018 the 1st period hourly wage was \$21.01 based on an average journeyman wage of \$35.02. Wages are subject to union renegotiation. Family health care and pension when eligible.

The Apprenticeship:

The apprenticeship consists of 7,000 hours of on-the-job training and an additional 504 hours of related classroom instruction. Related training is usually conducted in a “block” of time in the winter on the apprentice’s own time. Satisfactory progress must be maintained in related training classes.

Typically it takes approximately 5 years to complete the program.

RANKING SYSTEM POINTS

Applicants will be placed in descending order in the RANKED POOL based on the number of points scored. You can earn points for having a driver's license, completing an approved pre-apprentice program, education related to the occupation, and also for work experience of one year or more.

- To receive points for classes, you must provide course certificates or school transcripts
- To receive points for work history, you must provide documentation of work hours (W-2's, letters from employers on company letterhead stating type of work performed and number of hours worked per year, pay stubs, DD214, or work history print-out from the State of Oregon employment division. (We cannot use resumés for scoring.)

All documentation must be provided at the time of application.
